Youth Leadership Project

Who may apply: Any student who is interested in leading a project to serve the Asian community, no age limitation.

Project: You can come up with your own project as long as it serves the Asian community. Mentorship will be provided by physicians from the WACAP. Each project can be presented by one student or a group of students.

Possible ideas:

- Join in the project led by Jasmine Shen and Enoch Chung: centralized website for health education for the Chinese-speaking community. Jasmine and Enoch is on the Mary Gate leadership scholarship to lead this project.
- Create medication/allergy cards for seniors (collaborate with Seattle Senior Center)
- Organize medical education lectures in the community (Kristin Yao led the first lecture and can co-lead the project)
- Organize free medical consultations (requires time commitment)
- Increase awareness for blood donation (collaborate with bloodbank)

Application: one page, no word limit, can be in English or Chinese. Describe the project you propose, your timeline to finish the project, and the support you will need from the WACAP. 2-3 projects will be selected.

Volunteer hours & Award: You will need to present your proposed project to the committee in end June 2018. Certificates for service hours will be provided. If your project is selected, you will also need to present the outcome to the committee in October-November 2018.

The student(s) or group(s) who excel at the project will receive community awards from WACAP along with a \$100 gift card (for the group).
